TOR consultation with children and young people for UNCRC DGD on children's rights and alternative care

1. Who will be responsible for facilitating the consultation?

- See point 2 of [the ToR](#). The CSOs group will facilitate the running of the consultation, leveraging their local staff support and networks across the world.

2. What is the role of the consultant(s) in the training/ briefing of the data collection teams and in quality control? Should this be included in the days allocated for this work?

- See point 2 of [the ToR](#). The CSOs group can help develop guidelines/a short guide to brief adults who support the collection of children and young people's responses. The consultant(s) is asked to contribute/input to ensure alignment with the methodology. Quality control of data is linked to the methodology that the consultant(s) will propose. However, it is understood that the consultant(s) cannot fully control data quality, as this is particularly difficult in case of online surveys or facilitation by an adult who supports the child or young person to participate. Yet, the technical proposal of the applicant should offer a view on how to mitigate the risks related to data quality.

3. Do you have an idea of the scale of these consultations? (number of countries/contexts...)

- Global. As many countries as possible, with balanced representation between "Global North" and "Global South". We welcome the views of children and young people from a variety of experiences of the child protection system and/or alternative care, with the aim to be as inclusive and diverse as possible.

4. Can you provide more detail on the role of the child and youth committees? Can you tell us more about liaison with the child and youth committees?

- The CAT (Child Advisory Team) and the YAT (Youth Advisory Team) are two groups of selected child and youth representatives with care experience, that contribute to shape the Day of General Discussion on Children's Rights and Alternative Care, including the concept note, how to make the day child friendly, etc. They will contribute to shape the consultation to make them child-friendly and potentially lead them with peers in their country. Exchange between these teams and the consultant(s) will be facilitated by the CSOs group.

5. Do you have any further thoughts on the scope of the consultation and the kind of issues you would like to explore? What do you hope to achieve from the consultation in terms of influencing the day of general discussion?

- The Day of General Discussion focuses on children's rights and alternative care (see the [concept note at this link](#) for more detailed information). The specific issues of the discussion will be based on children and young people's inputs and priorities, and the global consultation should help collect their voices to this end. So there are no pre-determined issues.
