### The Problem





80% have one or both parents alive, globally

~370,000 children in institutions in India

Over 54% of children placed in institutions in India stay there for over 10 years

JJA recommends a caseload of 1:50. In reality, it's closer to 1:75 or 1:100

#### Family & Social Relationships

- % pursuing education, % dropped out
- # youth employed with living wage

### **Living Conditions**

- Safe neighborhood
- Access to basic amenities (safe water, toilets, furniture)

### Household Economy

- Secure income
- Ability to pay bills, utilities, basic needs



### Overview of Thrive Scale<sup>TM</sup>


Assessment and Planning Tool used for:

- Prevention of family separation
- Pre-reintegration
- Post-reintegration follow up

Child and family's thoughts on reintegration are solicited at every step

Red Flags identify safety concerns that must be addressed prior to reintegration








### Thrive Scale™ – Baseline





#### **Cases of Disruption**

- Return to institution
- Transfer to different institution or reintegration option

#### **Children with Red Flags**

- Abuse
- Child Marriage
- Insecure income/employment
- Unsafe living situation/community
- Not enrolled in education
- Overall rate down from 26% of 208 children to 18% of 394 children



### Aligning with National Care Reform



Juvenile Justice Act - India's framework for alternative care

- State Government Priorities for Care Reform
  - National push to get children out of institutions
  - Better case mgmt to assess children's need for staying in institutions, family's capacity to care for children
- Still need to figure out how to utilize the data at state, national level

## Goal 1: Poverty

### **SDG Targets**

- 1.2 Reduce at least by half the proportion of men, women and children of all ages living in poverty in all its dimensions according to national definitions
- 1.3 Implement nationally appropriate social protection systems and measures for all, including floors, and by 2030 achieve substantial coverage of the poor and the vulnerable

#### **Miracle Contributions**

- Link families to support resources and scheme, direct funding
- Track availability of basic needs in family (food, clothing, shelter)
- Prevent separation
   /reintegrate children
   for better child
   outcomes

#### **How We Can Measure**

- HTS (Household Economy) % children rated Safe/ Thriving:
  - secure employment to support family's financial needs (Red Flag)
  - ability to provide food/clothing/supplies
  - ability to pay rent and bills
- Number of families availing schemes/support (for social protection systems healthcare, education, income security - gov't or non-gov't sources)
   Core Metric
- Observe any policies or schemes implemented related to FBAC after Miracle's advocacy

### **Future Considerations**

- Measure proportion of families living below the poverty line
  - Track economic situation of families





# Goal 4: Quality Education

### **SDG Targets**

 4.3 - Ensure equal access for all women and men to affordable and quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university

#### **Miracle Contributions**

- Track attendance and performance in school
- Higher education and vocational training
- Career counseling

#### **How We Can Measure**

- % of children followed up by Miracle attending higher education/vocational training - tracked for Base Model, can get for Salesian too
- % of children followed up by Miracle dropped out of education (school, HE, Voc) - tracked for Base Model, can get for Salesian too
- HTS (Education): % children rated Safe or Thriving for "children attending higher education/vocational training if desired"
- % CCIs rated Yes on CCI TS milestone: Do all school age children attend school, college, etc.?

### **Future Considerations**

- Focus on educational proficiency
- Measure literacy and numeracy



# Goal 8: Economic Growth, Employment, Decent Work

#### **SDG Targets**

- 8.5 Achieve full and productive employment and decent work for all women and men, including for young people and persons with disabilities, and equal pay for work of equal value
- 8.6 Substantially reduce the proportion of youth not in employment, education or training

#### **Miracle Contributions**

- Career Counseling
- Scholarships for higher education and vocational training
- Employment of caregiver

#### **How We Can Measure**

- # of young people employed with living wage Core Metric
- HTS (Household Economy) % of children rated Safe or Thriving for Secure employment to support family's financial needs Red Flag
- #/% dropout from school/higher education/vocational training

### **Future Considerations**

 Long-term follow-up with youth to track employment and economic opportunities



# Connect the US Foster Care System



### The Problem



### The Foster System must provide stability for foster children in care

The system lacks connection and stability

40% of case managers quit each year 90% of agencies have trouble retaining staff

Up to 60% of foster families drop out their first year, citing a lack of critical support, communication and education


Kids pay the cost. **The average foster child moves 7 times**, loses 4-6 months of education and has a 50% chance of graduating high school.




