

FOREIGN EXCHANGE

Traveller's cheques and foreign currency notes of all major currencies can be exchanged at any commercial bank. American Express offices and most category A and B hotels have exchange facilities for guests. Fluctuations in foreign exchange markets are reflected in new rates daily.

INTERNET/WIFI SYSTEM

The ICC has permanent "hotspots" such that del gates can access the Internet anywhere within the ICC. Delegates will require wirelessenabled devices such as laptops. SITE VISIT 1 KwaZulu-Natal Society for the Blind

The KZNSB was established in 1919 and has evolved into a dynamic

organization offering an excellent range of multi-disciplinary rehabilitative and developmental services for blind children and adults residing in KwaZulu-Natal (KZN).

SITE VISIT 2

Community Outreach Centre, St Mary's (COC)

COC is an NGO situated on the premises of St Mary's Hospital in Mariannhill, KZN. It offers care and empowerment programme with its core focus being home based care and orphan and vulnerable child care. They currently have 384 trained volunteers caring for 800 adults and 2500 vulnerable children. The programme is 3 pronged: home visits, psychosocial support groups in schools and drop-in centers.

SITE VISIT 3

The Valley Trust

The Valley Trust was established in 1953 as a socio-medical project that promoted the health of people through nutrition education and multiple initiatives to enhance people's capacity to realize their potential and to take responsibility to enhance the quality of their lives.

SITE VISIT 4

Sinokuthulo Women's Empowerment Project
