

Inter-agency Structure






Policy on Alternative Care

- Concepts:
 - Residential (institutional) care
 - Non-residential care
- Definitions of Alternative care Models:
 - Residential Care (orphanages, recovery/rehab centers, shelters)
 - Group Home based Care
 - Community and Family based Care (incl. kinship care, foster care, child headed households, adoption)
 - Pagoda- and other Faith-based Care




Policy (cont'd)

- Principles
 - Family to institutional
 - Permanent to provisional
 - National to international
 - Institutional care as temporary option and last resort
 - Best interest of the child; Non-discrimination; Right to survival, development, participation and protection
- Specific Objectives

Standards on Residential Care

Main Features

- Definition & Registration
- Wellbeing and Development
 - Health and Hygiene
 - Clothing and Shoes
 - Social and cultural development
 - Education
 - Discipline (punishment)
 - Participation



Main Features (cont'd)

- Premises
- Management
 - Responsibilities of caregivers
 - Caregivers Requirements
 - Complaints and Legal Protection
 - Record keeping
- Miscellaneous
 - Relationship with the Community
 - Contact with Parents and Relatives
