# WHO IS ZAMBIA ASSOCIATION OF CHILDCARE WORKERS?

- ZACCW is a professional Association focused on developing and supporting Child and Youth Care Workers (CYCWs) in Zambia
- The Association was registered in 2005
- We develop through BASIC QUALIFICATION IN CHILDCARE (BQCC) as a foundation and other follow-up trainings

- •We provide on-going support through Professional meetings, debriefing from the field and discussion forums
- •To date we have opened 5 Chapter out of the 10 Provinces, going into the 6<sup>th</sup> this year

#### Scope of work

- 1. Coordinating and promoting quality standards in CYCW
- 2. Capacity building of CYCWs and leadership
- 3. Awareness-raising
- 4. Networking in the field
- 5. Research and Advocacy

# We have played a role in legislation and policy in the area of CYCW

- ✓ BQCC has been adopted as part of the minimum standards of care by the Govt and included in the Childcare policy.
- ✓ We have spoken strongly to most of the legislation involving children in the Country

#### **CURRENT STATUS OF CYCW IN ZAMBIA**

- •We currently have registered homes around 190 childcare facilities in the Country
- Our estimated number of CYCWs directly working with children is around 2,600 excluding Community schools
- This number is highly mobile because of instability of employment in the Sector

#### Recognition of the Sector

- oln terms of identity CYCWs are largely still regarded as Volunteer/ Caregivers (lowest ladder of work??)
- Where more specific professional categories exist, may be related to these groups, e.g. para social workers, auxiliary child and youth care workers or social work assistants

- Recognition through Certification is provided by ZACCW
- A certificate program has also been approved by TEVETA
- oThose trained are made to adhere to a code of conduct which they sign before the office of the Director of Social Welfare
- At State level this Sector is recognised but yet to be regarded as a Profession

#### WHAT DEFINES CYCWs

- •CYCWs work in the LIFE SPACE OF A CHILD
- They walk with the child through their pains, successes, growth and discoveries
- CYCWs WORK IN THE MOMENT
- ✓ They do not attend to children by schedule but respond in the immediate environment

# CYCW applying their skills



### Developing: Professional progression (Training & Career path)

- Currently the professional progression path is not clear for CYCWs in Zambia
- Most CYCWs see little motivation for further study
- olt seems all roads lead to becoming a Social Worker
- •This is not our desired goal, we still need a cadre in the Life Space

## Role of CYCWs in Childcare Reform

- CYCWs are the end users of all policy positions
- > They test the strength of policies
- They have capacity to shift the direction of childcare
- They would give better feed back on the effectiveness or weakness of policies

- 2. They are a reservoir of knowledge and experience
- They would therefore provide better research information in childcare
- They are capable of generating indigenous, home grown care practices so that children in alternative care are not isolated from their culture

- 3. They are directly involved and are at home in the Communities
- Hence they can influence the Community mind-set on childcare
- Because they speak the language of the community, they are capable of bringing childcare reform into each household

#### CONCLUSION

- CYCW's role in Childcare Reform as implementers, feedback providers and setting the pace for effective childcare cannot be over emphasised.
- CYCWs remain committed partners in ensuring families and communities own up to their responsibilities
- Importantly we need to give more voice to CYCWs to speak into such processes as Childcare Reform
